

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INTRODUCTION

Quarry project of **M/s St. Basil Granites** is situated at Sy. No. 332/4, 340/5, 340/4 pt, 331/4, 331/6 p, 340/3,340/3p and 340/4p at Pananchery village and Panchayath, Thrissur Taluk, Thrissur District, Kerala.

The quarry project was accorded with the Environmental Clearance (EC) by State Environmental Impact Assessment Authority on 02.01.2014. The half yearly compliance report needs to be submitted as part of general condition No.37 of Environmental Clearance order by the project proponent. The compliance report of Second half to the specific conditions and general conditions of the Environmental Clearance for the period of **October -2019 – March 2020** is being submitted.


The quarry project was not in operation from period 11th of October 2019 to 29th of April 2020 due to the stop memo issued from the Mining and geology department wide Notice number 1991/C2/TDO/18 dt.10th of October 2019. By this notice the department banned quarrying operation within 10 Km vicinity of WLS/NP. The notice from mining and geology department is attached as **Annexure No.14**.

Therefore, the project proponent could not extract miner minerals from October 2019 to March 2020.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE PROJECT

The project comes under Category B, Activity 1 (a), (i) as per the Schedule of EIA Notification 2006 (since it is below 50 hectares) and as per O.M No. L-11011/47/2011-IA.II (M) dated 18th May 2012 of Ministry of Environment and Forests. It is further categorized as Category B2 as per the O.M No. J-13012/12/2013-IA-II (I) dt.24.12.2013 of Ministry of Environment and Forests, since the area of the project is below 25 hectares.

Geographical location of the project site is in 10⁰34'14.55 to 10⁰34'29.6596" Latitude (N) and 76⁰21'40.2541" to 76⁰21'40.2541"(E). The quarry is interlinked with a Crusher / M sand unit located within the complex. The Capacity is 2, 94,000 MTA. There are no litigations against the lease area or applicant in any court of law. Topography is hilly. Highest elevation is 100m MSL and lowest 63m MSL. The approximate daily water demand is 6 KLD and total power requirement is 150 kw.



Compliance:

To collect rain water from the entire mining area, the project proponent has developed rain water harvesting pond in the project site. The storm water flow is leading to the pond through drainage. The water from pond is mainly used for crusher work, watering of plants, wetting of roads and sprinkler system for contain dust emission. The photograph of Rain water collection pond is provided in **Plate No. 1**

Compliance:

To enrich vegetation and prevent air pollution, the project proponent planted various avenue trees along either side of the roads, parking area and other areas in the project land. There are natural vegetations including trees, shrubs, herbs and climbers also present in the project area. This vegetation is working as green belt against emitting dust. The details of vegetation are given below. The copy of bill from nursery is given in **Annexure No.1**. The photograph of avenue trees is attached as **Plate No. 2**.

04The project shall incorporate devices for solar energyCompliedgeneration and utilization wherever possible.

Compliance:

The project proponent has installed two solar street lights in the project site to use maximum renewable energy to reduce electrical consumption from KSEB. As part of this, the project proponent could reduce the use of energy from conventional sources. The photograph of solar street lights and solar panel is provided in **Plate No.3**. The purchasing bill of solar street light is given in **Annexure No. 2**.

05 Sprinklers shall be installed and used in the project site to Complied contain dust emissions.

Compliance:

To prevent dust emission, sprinklers are installed in the project site. The sprinklers installed in and around the crusher unit. In order to reduce dust emissions from the road while transportation of materials, the project proponent is spraying water on roads during summer season at regular intervals. The photographs showing the effective utilization of sprinklers in the project area is provided in **Plate No.4**.

As part of eco restoration, the project proponent started to plant various saplings within the project area. 07At least 10 percent out of the total excavated pit area should be
retained as water storage areas and the remaining area should
be reclaimed with stacked dumpings and overburden and
planted with indigenous plant species that are eco-friendly.Will be
complied

Compliance:

The project proponent is intending to retain 10 percent of total excavated pit as rain water storage area after closure of the mine. The remaining area will be reclaimed with stacked dumping of overburden and top soil. As part of its eco – restoration plan, the project proponent will plant indigenous plant species that are eco – friendly on the reclaimed area.

08 Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) agreed upon by the Complied proponent should be implemented in tune with the conditions specified in the Companies Act, 2013

Compliance:

The quarry project was not in operation from 11th of October 2019 to 29th of April 2020. Therefore the project proponent could not undertake activities for social integration and community development in the period of October 2019 to March 2019.

09 Barbed metal wire fencing around the mining area shall be Complied provided with a height of not less than 5 ft so that the falling of animals/human beings/dumping of garbages etc. does not happen

Compliance:

As part of demarcation of lease area and to prevent falling of animals/human being/dumping of garbage etc, the project proponent has erected barbed metal wire fencing around the mining area with height of 5ft. of 5 ft. The purchase bill of materials is given in **Annexure No.3**. The photograph of barbed metal wire fencing is provided in **Plate No.6**.

10 Warning alarms indicating the time of blasting (to be done at complied specific timings) has to be arranged as per stipulations of Explosive Department.

Compliance:

As per the stipulation of Explosive department, the project proponent has installed warning alarms in the quarry site. This warning alarm is properly working prior to the blasting time. The timing of blasting in the quarry is in between 1.00 pm on all working days. The photograph of the warning alarm is provided at **Plate No. 7.**

11 Control measures on noise and vibration prescribed by KSPCB complied should be implemented.

Compliance:

To reduce noise level in the project site, the project proponent has implemented mitigate masseurs. The major noise generating sources from the mining activity is working machineries, drilling, blasting and plying of vehicles. The following control measures are undertaken to bringing down the noise levels:-

- Proper maintenance of machinery and equipments
- The machineries like breaker and excavator has well sound proof cabin so that the machine operators can work without stress due to the sound.
- Personal protective devices i.e., earmuffs, ear plugs etc. are provided to workers working in high noise areas.

- The mining activity held in day time only.
- Noise level at quarry site checked periodically. The sound levels are monitored through a NABL accredited laboratory during the quarry and crusher is in operation and the monitored results are well within the permissible limits.

Blast vibrations and control measures

- Controlled blasting technique is adopted in this project in order to reduce blast vibrations.
- The maximum charge per delay is not more than 10kg to limit the PPV values to 10mm/sec.
- Optimum delay sequence and stem to column ratio is maintaining to minimize the ground vibration intensity.
- Appointed qualified personals for the blasting operation

12Quarrying activities should be limited to day time as per KSPCBCompliedguidelines.

Compliance:

To reduce the adverse effect of quarrying activities in the community, the mining activity is limited to day time only as per KSPCB guidelines. The quarry working time is 8.00am to 5.00 pm.

13Blasting should be done in a controlled manner as specified by
the regulations of explosives department or any other
concerned agency.Complied

Compliance:

The project proponent has appointed a license person to supervise and monitor all the activities carrying out in the project site. The blasting is done in controlled manner by using ordinary delayed detonators. All blasting activities are carrying out with the specified regulations of explosive department.

14A licensed person should supervise/control the blastingCompliedoperations.

Compliance:

The project proponent has appointed a mining mate and second class manager to supervise/control the blasting operations for the exploitation of minor minerals from the project site. **Annexure No. 4** showing the certificate of Licensed Person.

15 Access roads to the quarry shall be tarred to contain dust Complied emissions that may arise during transportation of materials.

Compliance:

To contain dust emissions and for the trouble free transportation of materials, the project proponent has tarred the access road of 450 meter from the entrance of project site to quarry is maintaining in good manner. The project proponent splashes water on the road to arrest the dust production during summer season. The photograph of tarred road is provided in **Plate No. 8**.

16 Overburden materials should be managed within the site and Complied the old quarries, if any, should be restored.

Compliance:

The overburden and topsoil need to extract during the time of mining, these natural resources are being staked in the project site. The overburden materials are stored within the site at designated place. This will be used for plantation, haulage roads and land filling in the mining area. No overburden will let out from the project site. The photograph is showing the same in **Plate No.9**.

17Height of the benches should not exceed 5m and width shouldCompliednot be less than 5m.

Compliance:

The quarrying activity in the project site is progressing by creating benches of 5m width and 5m height. The mining is done under the direction and supervision of competent person. **Plate No.10** showing the work progressing in the quarry area.

18 Mats to reduce fly rock blast to a maximum of 10 PPV should be Noted provided.

Compliance:

The project proponent is using ordinary delayed detonator, therefore there is no incident of fly rock is happened in the community. The project proponent is also assuring the maximum PPV is under 10 during the time of blasting. The project proponent is yet to use blasting mats in the mining field.

19 Mining depth should not exceed beyond 40 m, unless otherwise Will be specified or not below the level of the nearest stream bed, complied whichever is less.

Compliance:

The project proponent will follow the approved mining plan for the exploration of building stone. Therefore mining depth will not exceed beyond 10 meter or not below the level of the nearest stream bed, whichever is less.

Compliance:

To reduce the impact of sound to the labours in the unit, the project proponent has provided ear plugs. And there is a crusher unit functioning in the project site; the machines of crusher unit are housed with hollow bricks. The photograph of crusher is provided in **Plate No.11.** Vegetation around the mining area will help to reduce noise and air pollution. This helps the noise level kept within prescribed standards. The project proponent is trying to enhance the vegetative cover by planting more tree saplings.

22 The workers on the site should be provided with the required Complied protective equipments such as ear muffs, helmet, etc.

Compliance:

To ensure the safety of labours in working site the project proponent has provided adequate Personnel Protective Equipments (PPE) such as helmets, ear plugs, safety belts, glows, etc. The photograph of the workers with PPE is given in the **Plate No. 12.** The copy of bill purchased for Personal Protective Equipments is attached as **Annexure No. 5**.

23 Garland drains with clarifiers to be provided in the lower slopes Complied around the core area to channelize storm water.

Compliance:

As part of effective management of storm water, the project proponent has constructed storm water drains in the lower slopes of the project area. The natural drain in the mining area helps to channelize the storm water to the pond created at mining area. The debris and sediments will be settled down in the bottom of the pond. The clarifiers will be installed soon. The photograph of drain is provided in **Plate No. 13**.

Compliance:

The project proponent assure that the trucks are covered to avoid dust emission from the vehicle while transportation of materials. A photograph of covered trucks is provided in **Plate No. 14.**

As part of concurrent eco restoration, the project proponent has planted various saplings in the project area as a compensation of loss of trees while clearing the land for mining. Compliance:

A portion of spent oil is using in as lubricant in the project site. The excess used oil will be sold only to the approved recyclers






